Nuran, a handicraft (Kruchupi) artisan, have two children: Sufian, 10 years old and in 1st grade, and Farhan, 4 years old. The family faced daily hardships to make ends meet, struggling to provide for their basic needs.





In 2022, Priya Akter joined the Family **Development Group of VARD (Voluntary** Association for Rural Development) in Bangladesh, driven by a strong desire to improve her family's income. Seeing an opportunity change to circumstances, she decided to take advantage of a loan program offered by VARD in collaboration with the MVM Fund. After thoughtful discussion with her husband, Priya chose to establish a sewing business and received an initial loan of 10,000 Taka. She promptly repaid this loan, and as time passed, her small business began to flourish.

On June 5, 2024, Priya secured a second loan of 30,000 Taka with the goal of expanding her sewing business.

She has consistently repaid her loans, and as a result, her business continues to thrive.

Today, her capital stands at approximately 35,000 Taka, and she earns a monthly net profit of around 5,000 Taka.

This newfound financial stability has brought immense joy to her family, and they are now preparing for their son's admission to a reputable school next year.
